
The release of this information would allow unfettered access to it and this would hinder the ability of the investigators to pursue investigative leads in this matter and hinder the ongoing criminal investigation.

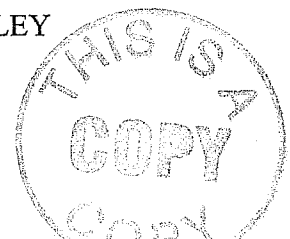
AFFIDAVIT

I, William McCauley, hereby depose and state the following:

1. I am an Assistant District Attorney;
2. I am assigned to the investigation of the homicide of Odin Lloyd which occurred in North Attleboro on or about June 17, 2013;
3. This investigation into this homicide is active and ongoing. The investigation is likely to be ongoing for an extended period of time and will include the use of the Bristol County Grand Jury;
4. The search warrants that are the subject of this motion describe the focus of the investigation as well as the Commonwealth's view of the evidence which led to the issuance of the warrant;
5. In my experience and the experience of other investigators, the destruction of physical evidence and/or possibility that witness information will be altered is inherent in an investigation of this type and the risk of either of these occurrences would be increased if the information contained in these warrants, returns, affidavits, applications and these motions is publicly released;
6. Consequently release of this information would interfere with the Commonwealth's ability to continue to obtain information relevant and material to the investigation; and
7. Because of the non-public nature of the Commonwealth's request, the fact of the ongoing investigation, the possibility that the investigation will be harmed if the information is released and the use of the powers of the Grand Jury in this request, the Commonwealth believes that all materials submitted with this motion should be Sealed and Impounded.

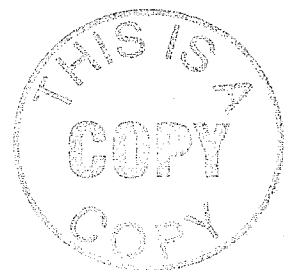
COURT ORDER

Affidavit in Support of Search Warrant

I, Trooper Eric J. Benson #3389, being duly sworn, depose and say:

I am a Massachusetts State Police Trooper and have been so employed since September 22, 2006. I am currently assigned to the Bristol County State Police Detective Unit attached to the Bristol County District Attorney's Office and have been so assigned since November of 2009. My primary responsibilities include the investigation of unattended natural deaths, accidental deaths, suicides, and homicides.

I have personal knowledge of the facts and circumstances related below, as the result of my own investigative efforts and those of other police officers who have reported their findings to me.

I have probable cause to believe that the crime of Murder, a violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 was committed in an unimproved area in the vicinity of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro on or about Monday, June 17, 2013.

I also have probable cause to believe that Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11-6-1989) (SS#: 042-86-7555) committed the following crimes on Monday, June 17, 2013: Murder of Odin Lloyd in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 and Possession of Firearm without a License in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 269, section 10(a).

Additionally, I have probable cause to believe that Ernest G. Wallace Jr. (DOB: 01/28/1972) committed the crime of Accessory After the Fact to Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 274, section 4 on Monday, June 17, 2013.

I further have probable cause to believe that evidence of the crimes of Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 and Accessory After the Fact to Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 274, section 4 will be found on and within a gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 [VIN: 2C3CCAAG0DH665474]. The facts establishing the grounds for my request to the court for the issuance of a search warrant for the gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 [VIN: 2C3CCAAG0DH665474] are as follows:



Initial Response

On Monday, June 17, 2013, at approximately 5:37 p.m., the North Attleboro Police Department responded to a cellular 911 call reporting a dead body in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. The North Attleboro Police Department responded to a secluded area in the area of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro and located a deceased male lying supine on the ground. The initial responding police officers observed several apparent gunshot wounds in the upper torso area of the then unidentified deceased black male. The initial responding officers further observed a small amount of blood in the area of the apparent gunshot wounds. The initial responding officers located five (5) .45 caliber discharged cartridge casings on the ground in the immediate area of the deceased male body. The initial responding officers also located a white towel on the ground in the area where the deceased male was discovered. The initial responding officers did not observe a firearm in the area of the deceased male. The initial responding officers observed a set of automobile tire tracks that appeared to have been recently made in relatively close proximity to the deceased male. The area where the deceased male was found is remotely located and used as a processing area for construction materials such as dirt, gravel, stone, asphalt, and fill. The police did not observe any vehicles at the location where the black male individual was found deceased.

The police conducted a search of the body of the deceased black male during the processing of the crime scene on Monday, June 17, 2013. The police observed that the pants pockets of the deceased male appeared to be undisturbed, leading the police to believe that no post-mortem attempt had been made to remove items from the pants pockets of the victim.

A wallet containing a Massachusetts Drivers License bearing the name Odin L. Lloyd (DOB: 11/14/1985) of 10 Fayston Street, Apt. # 2, in Boston was located inside the right rear pants pocket of the deceased black male. The photograph on Odin Lloyd's Massachusetts Driver's License matched the general physical appearance of the deceased male. Two sets of keys for a black 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration 442-427 were located in the front right pants pocket of the deceased male individual presumptively identified as Odin Lloyd. The keychain attached to the two sets of keys for the 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration 442-427 indicated that the vehicle was owned by Enterprise Rent-A-Car. An HTC 1 cellular telephone was located in the right front sweatshirt pocket of the deceased male presumptively identified as Odin Lloyd. An amount of \$64.75 in loose cash was located in the back left pants pocket of Odin Lloyd.

The police contacted Enterprise Rent-A-Car at T.F. Green Airport in Rhode Island and learned that the vehicle described on the keys in the pocket of Odin Lloyd (2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration 442-427) was currently being rented by Aaron Hernandez of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. A check of the Massachusetts Registry of Motor Vehicles database showed an Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11-6-1989) with an address of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.



Next of Kin Notification and Preliminary Family Interviews

On the night of Monday, June 17, 2013, police officers traveled to Odin Lloyd's residential address of 10 Fayston Street in Boston in order to attempt to make a death notification to his next of kin. Officers notified Odin Lloyd's next of kin and interviewed some of his friends and family members upon their arrival at 10 Fayston Street in Boston on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013. The officers observed Aaron Hernandez's rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban, the keys to which were found in Odin Lloyd's pocket, backed into the yard behind a chain link fence at 10 Fayston Street in Boston.

Officers interviewed Odin Lloyd's sister, Shaquilla Thibou, following the death notification. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that she lived with Odin Lloyd at 10 Fayston Street, Apt. #2, in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou further indicated that she last saw Odin Lloyd in front of 10 Fayston Street in Boston between approximately 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou went on to indicate that she last saw Odin Lloyd when he entered a silver four door car with three other males whose identities she did not know in the area of 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that the silver vehicle left the area after Odin Lloyd entered the vehicle. Shaquilla Thibou told investigators that she had never seen this silver car before Odin Lloyd entered the vehicle on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further indicated Odin Lloyd was dating a woman named Shaneah. Shaquilla Thibou explained that Shaneah was the sister of Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend, Shayanna Jenkins. Shaquilla Thibou stated that, other than Aaron Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins, she did not know of any other individuals who Odin Lloyd knew in the North Attleboro area. Shaquilla Thibou showed investigators some of the text messages that Odin Lloyd had sent to her after he entered the silver vehicle on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou explained these text messages to investigators and are described below in this affidavit.

Initial contact with Aaron Hernandez and Shayanna Jenkins

Officers traveled to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro and attempted to make contact with the occupants of the residence on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013. The officers were initially unable to make contact with any of the residents of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. While attempting to make contact with the residents, officers observed three (3) large surveillance cameras permanently affixed to the exterior of the residence. Officers also observed that the television and numerous lights were on inside the residence. Despite repeated efforts to summons the occupants, no one came to the door of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Based on the totality of the circumstances that brought the police to the residence and the inability of the police to make contact with the residents, the officers went to the rear of the 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro to determine if there was any forced entry or sign of the occupants. The officers did not observe any signs of forced entry or the residents of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

The officers then proceeded to a neighboring residence and spoke with a neighbor who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots. The individual who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots indicated that he had last seen Aaron



Hernandez, a player for the New England Patriots, at football practice on Thursday, June 13, 2013. The individual who identified himself as a coach for the New England Patriots did not have any contact information for Aaron Hernandez and was unable to provide any information as to the whereabouts of Aaron Hernandez.

These same officers returned to their vehicle and were parked on the street in front of Aaron Hernandez's residence when they observed Aaron Hernandez exit his residence and walk down the driveway in their direction at approximately 10:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez told the officers that he had seen them parked in front of the house through his video surveillance system. The officers identified themselves and asked Aaron Hernandez questions about the Chevrolet Suburban he had rented. Aaron Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle for his friend "O." When asked who "O" was, Aaron Hernandez replied "Odin." When asked how he knew Odin, Aaron Hernandez stated that his girlfriend's sister was dating Odin. Aaron Hernandez stated that he had rented the vehicle from Enterprise Rent-A-Car on Route 1 in North Attleboro. When asked when he last saw Odin, Aaron Hernandez replied that he last saw Odin "up his way yesterday," indicating that he last saw Odin in Boston on Sunday, June 16, 2013. Although Aaron Hernandez was unable to provide the officers with the location where he last saw Odin, he stated that he (Aaron Hernandez) saved the address in his GPS. Aaron Hernandez then became argumentative with the officers, and asked: "what's with all the questions?" Aaron Hernandez then stated that the police would need to speak with his attorney. Aaron Hernandez entered his residence, locking the door behind him, and retrieved a business card for his attorney. Aaron Hernandez then unlocked the door and handed his attorney's business card to the officers. When the officers told Aaron Hernandez that they were conducting a death investigation, Aaron Hernandez slammed the door and locked it behind him. Aaron Hernandez did not ask the officers whose death was being investigated nor did he display any outward signs of concern. Contact was then made with Aaron Hernandez's attorney.

The officers returned to their vehicle once again. Shortly after the officers returned to their vehicle, Aaron Hernandez exited his residence and stated that he would follow the officers to the police station to speak with the police. Aaron Hernandez stated that his girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) would give him a ride to the police station. The officers followed Aaron Hernandez and his girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) to the North Attleboro Police Department. Aaron Hernandez's girlfriend (Shayanna Jenkins) drove away after dropping Aaron Hernandez off at the North Attleboro Police Department. Aaron Hernandez entered the police station and was escorted to the Detective Division. Aaron Hernandez awaited the arrival of his attorneys in an interview room within the Detective Division of the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators observed Aaron Hernandez lying on the floor of the interview room while awaiting the arrival of his attorney. Aaron Hernandez was also observed using his cellular telephone while inside the interview room at the North Attleboro Police Department.

Investigators followed Shayanna Jenkins out of the parking lot and stopped Shayanna Jenkins' vehicle a short distance away from the North Attleboro Police Department. Investigators then spoke with Shayanna Jenkins (DOB: 05/29/1989). Investigators informed Shayanna Jenkins about the death of Odin Lloyd. Shayanna Jenkins immediately began to cry upon learning that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shayanna Jenkins agreed to speak to the



investigators where her vehicle had been stopped because her child was sleeping in the back seat of the vehicle.

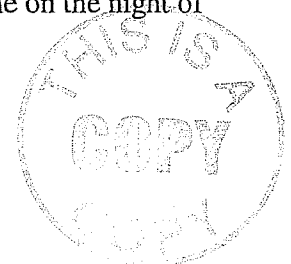
Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and her boyfriend, Aaron Hernandez, live together at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that Odin Lloyd was in a dating relationship with her sister, Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that she was not very familiar with Odin Lloyd and claimed not to know Odin Lloyd's family or any of Odin Lloyd's friends. Shayanna Jenkins indicated that Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd knew each other through Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she last saw Odin Lloyd at approximately 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez were both inside the black Chevrolet Suburban at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez and Odin Lloyd discussed returning the rental vehicle to Enterprise Rent-A-Car.

Shayanna Jenkins indicated that Odin Lloyd smoked marijuana and was also a marijuana dealer. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she would often observe Odin Lloyd on his telephone talking about marijuana sales. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Odin Lloyd's telephone was constantly ringing and that he was frequently talking in "lingo," leading her to believe the conversations were about marijuana sales. Investigators have spoken with more than two dozen individuals who knew Odin Lloyd and have not located any other witness who described Odin Lloyd as a large scale drug dealer.

Shayanna Jenkins provided investigators with the cellular telephone numbers for Aaron Hernandez and her sister, Shaneah Jenkins. Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone number was (203)-606-8969. Aaron Hernandez had a cellular telephone in his possession while he was at the North Attleboro Police Department on Monday, June 17, 2013. An investigator called the telephone number (203)-606-8969 while Aaron Hernandez was at the North Attleboro Police Department on Monday, June 17, 2013. The cellular telephone that Aaron Hernandez had in his possession was observed to ring when the investigator called telephone number (203)-606-8969 on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez answered his cellular telephone, but the investigator hung up without speaking to Aaron Hernandez.

Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and Aaron Hernandez had recently installed a video surveillance system within their residence. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that this video surveillance system would allow for the viewing of both the front of their residence as well as the street. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that the video surveillance system recorded and played the video on their home entertainment system. Shayanna Jenkins stated that there had been several recent break-in attempts at their residence.

Shayanna Jenkins further stated that both she and Aaron Hernandez were home during the day on Sunday, June 16, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins stated that she and Aaron Hernandez had gone out to dinner for Father's Day and a babysitter had stayed with their infant child. Shayanna Jenkins further stated that she had gone to bed early but Aaron Hernandez had gone out on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013. Shayanna Jenkins went on to say that she was unsure who Aaron Hernandez had gone out with or what time Aaron Hernandez came home on the night of



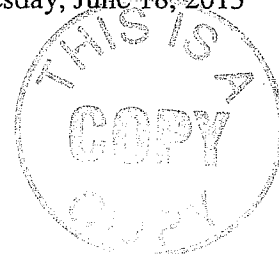
Sunday, June 16, 2013 into Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez called Shayanna Jenkins on her cellular telephone while she was speaking with the police and informed her that his sports agent said that she should not speak with the police and that she should request to speak with her attorney. Shayanna Jenkins then departed from the area of the North Attleboro Police Department.

Aaron Hernandez's attorneys arrived at the North Attleboro Police Department at approximately 12:30 a.m. on Tuesday, June 18, 2013. An Assistant District Attorney, a Massachusetts State Police Lieutenant, and a North Attleboro Police Detective Sergeant met with the attorneys in a conference room. Aaron Hernandez signed a consent to search form authorizing the warrantless search of his rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban bearing Rhode Island Registration 442-427 that was located at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Aaron Hernandez's attorneys agreed that the cellular telephone in the possession of Aaron Hernandez would be maintained without alteration until either Aaron Hernandez consented to provide his cellular telephone to the police or a search warrant was issued for the cellular telephone. Aaron Hernandez left the North Attleboro Police Department in the company of his attorneys on the morning of Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

Cellular Telephone Communication

Odin Lloyd's HTC 1 cellular telephone was searched by investigators for information related to the death of Odin Lloyd. Investigators learned that Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone number appeared as a contact in Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone contacts. The analysis of Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone revealed that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez engaged in extensive text and voice cellular telephone communication on Sunday, June 16, 2013 and Monday, June 17, 2013. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at approximately 9:05 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Odin Lloyd: "I'm coming to grab that tonight u gon b around I need dat and we could step for a little again [sic]." Odin Lloyd did not immediately respond to Aaron Hernandez's text message. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at approximately 9:34 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Odin Lloyd: "Waddup." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:37 p.m., Odin Lloyd responded: "Aite (meaning alright), where." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:39 p.m., Aaron Hernandez responded: "idk (meaning I don't know) it don't matter but imma hit u when I'm dat way like Las time if my phone dies imma hit u when I charge it which will be in a lil [sic]." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:00 p.m., Odin Lloyd responded: "Aite idk anything goin on [sic]" Aaron Hernandez's last text message to Odin Lloyd was at 10:13 p.m. on Sunday, June 16, 2013 and read: "I'll figure it out ill hit u on way." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 12:22 a.m., Odin Lloyd sent his last text message to Aaron Hernandez: "We still on." Odin Lloyd's call records show no further cellular telephone communication with Aaron Hernandez.

Odin Lloyd's HTC 1 cellular telephone call logs showed that Odin Lloyd received five (5) telephone calls from telephone number (860)-845-4304 between 1:22 a.m. and 2:32 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The last answered incoming telephone call on Odin Lloyd's cellular telephone was from telephone number (860)-845-4304 at 2:32 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators called telephone number (860)-845-4304 several times on Tuesday, June 18, 2013.



in an attempt to contact the last person who spoke to Odin Lloyd by telephone. The telephone associated with telephone number (860)-845-4304 was not answered on Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, a search warrant was obtained for Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone. On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, investigators conducted a search of Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone and determined that telephone number (860)-845-4304 was listed in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone contact list. Investigators determined that telephone number (860)-845-4304 is listed as "Fish 2" in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone. Investigators were able to determine that the contact "Fish 2" in Aaron Hernandez's cellular telephone is Ernest G. Wallace Jr.

Text messages were located between Aaron Hernandez and two of his (Aaron Hernandez's) associates on the night of Sunday, June 16, 2013. On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:02 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to telephone number (860)-845-4304 (Ernest G. Wallace Jr.): "Please make it back cuZ I'm Def trying to step for alittle [sic]" On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 9:35 p.m., Aaron Hernandez sent a text message to Ernest Wallace: "Get ur as up here [sic]..." On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:23 p.m. Aaron Hernandez sent another text message to Ernest Wallace: "Hurry ur ass up nigga [sic]" On Sunday, June 16, 2013, at 10:21 p.m., Aaron Hernandez received a text message from his other male associate who advised: "On r way a... God bless [sic]" Aaron Hernandez then sent a text message to his other male associate: "Bet hurry up tell fish to drive nigga [sic]."

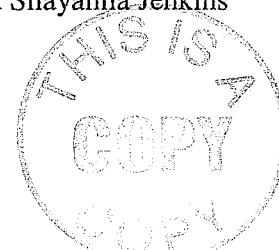
Interviews of Employees from Business in the Vicinity of the Crime Scene

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, and Tuesday, June 25, 2013, investigators interviewed employees from a business that is located within a few hundred yards of the crime scene. These employees described that they were on break between approximately 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Three employees of this business reported hearing multiple gunshots coming from the area where Odin Lloyd's body was located during their break between approximately 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Shaneah Jenkins

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 1:05 a.m., the police interviewed Shaneah Jenkins by telephone. Shaneah Jenkins explained that she was Odin Lloyd's girlfriend of over one (1) year. Shaneah Jenkins became very emotional when she was informed that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shaneah Jenkins claimed that she had not previously known that Odin Lloyd was deceased. Shaneah Jenkins stated that she did not know Odin Lloyd to have any connection to North Attleboro other than her sister, Shayanna Jenkins, and Aaron Hernandez.

Investigators have had further contact with Shaneah Jenkins and learned that Odin Lloyd spent time with Aaron Hernandez on Friday, June 14, 2013 and Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that she was contacted by her sister, Shayanna Jenkins, on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins further indicated that Shayanna Jenkins



explained that Odin Lloyd and Aaron Hernandez were together in Boston on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013 into Saturday, June 15, 2013 and that Aaron Hernandez had not returned home. Shaneah Jenkins went on to indicate that Shayanna Jenkins stated that Aaron Hernandez was not responding to her attempts to contact him (Aaron Hernandez) on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that she contacted Odin Lloyd on the morning of Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins further indicated that Odin Lloyd explained that he had gone out with Aaron Hernandez on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013 into Saturday, June 15, 2013. Shaneah Jenkins went on to indicate that Odin Lloyd stated that he and Aaron Hernandez got drunk and slept outside of the house. Shaneah Jenkins indicated that Aaron Hernandez allowed Odin Lloyd to use his rented 2013 Chevrolet Suburban on the morning of Saturday, June 17, 2013.

Rumor Nightclub

Investigators have interviewed witnesses working in and around Rumor Nightclub in Boston. Aaron Hernandez is observed entering the nightclub with Odin Lloyd on the night of Friday, June 14, 2013. Additionally, a witness who works in the area of Rumor Nightclub reported to investigators that he observed Aaron Hernandez with what appeared to be a handgun in his waistband on Friday, June 14, 2013.

Enterprise Rent-A-Car

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 10:00 a.m., investigators traveled to Enterprise Rent-A-Car located at 365 East Washington Street in North Attleboro. Investigators spoke with the Enterprise Rent-A-Car manager who indicated that he was familiar with Aaron Hernandez due to the fact that he (Aaron Hernandez) frequently rented vehicles from Enterprise Rent-A-Car. The manager informed the police that Aaron Hernandez came to Enterprise Rent-A-Car with two unknown male individuals at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager indicated that Aaron Hernandez returned a silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 that he had previously rented in his name. The manager further indicated that Aaron Hernandez rented a gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 upon returning the silver 2012 Nissan Altima at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager went on to indicate that Aaron Hernandez apologized for damage to the driver's side exterior side view mirror and driver's door of the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2. The manager indicated that although Aaron Hernandez apologized for the damage, he claimed not to know how the damage occurred. The manager further indicated that Aaron Hernandez explained that he just came outside and saw that the vehicle was damaged.

The silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 was viewed by the police at the Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. Investigators observed that there was damage to the front driver's side door. Investigators also observed that the side view mirror on the driver's side was mangled at the connection to the door and the mirror and housing were missing. Investigators further observed damage to the driver's side window and a chrome strip



at the driver's side window. There were also scratches on the driver's side door. Investigators observed soil, similar in color and appearance to that at the location where Odin Lloyd's body was found, on the tires and lower panels of the vehicle behind the tires. Similar soil was also seen within the tire tread(s) and wheel(s) well(s) of the silver Nissan Altima. Investigators also viewed the tire treads and the tire treads appear to be consistent with the tire marks left at the scene where the body of Odin Lloyd was found.

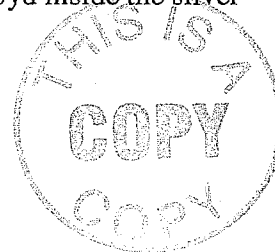
Enterprise Rent-A-Car consented to release the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 to the Massachusetts State Police. Investigators obtained a search warrant for the processing of this vehicle.

Search and Forensic Processing of the Nissan Altima

The 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 was analyzed by the Massachusetts State Police at the State Police Crime Laboratory in Lakeville. The 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 was processed for latent fingerprints by the Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located several fingerprints inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 that were individualized to Odin Lloyd. The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 that were individualized to an individual with several aliases to Ernest G. Wallace (DOB: 01/28/1972). The Massachusetts State Police Crime Scene Services Section also located fingerprint(s) inside the 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 that were individualized to another male individual who investigators have determined is associated with Aaron Hernandez.

Shaquilla Thibou

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, at approximately 4:14 p.m., Shaquilla Thibou was interviewed at the North Attleboro Police Department. Shaquilla Thibou was re-interviewed regarding the information she had concerning the last time she saw her brother alive. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she was speaking with her boyfriend in a car that was parked in the vicinity of her residence located at 10 Fayston Street in Boston on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further stated that her cellular telephone battery had died at some point while she was seated in the car speaking with her boyfriend. Shaquilla Thibou went on to say that she witnessed a silver four door sedan that she believed to be either a Nissan Altima, a Nissan Maxima, or a Toyota Camry pull up in front of her residence on Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:30 a.m. or 2:45 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou further stated that Odin Lloyd entered the silver vehicle through the rear passenger door and the vehicle drove away from the area of 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Shaquilla Thibou indicated that she believed that there were three other individuals in addition to Odin Lloyd inside the silver vehicle.



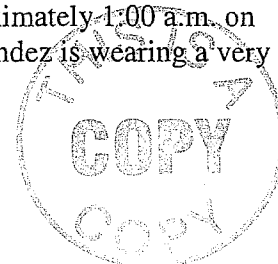
Shaquilla Thibou stated that she entered her apartment and plugged her cellular telephone into a charger on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she received two text messages from Odin Lloyd after she plugged her cellular telephone into the charger. The time stamp on her cellular phone indicated "JUN 17, 2013, 3:07AM" Shaquilla Thibou used this time stamp as a reference to recall the approximate time that she had seen her brother get into the silver four door sedan. Shaquilla Thibou stated that she believed that the time that she last saw Odin Lloyd was approximately 2:30 a.m. or 2:45 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 rather than the initial timeframe of between 1:00 a.m. and 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 that she initially provided to the police.

Video Surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro Showing Activities at the Residence Prior to Leaving to Meet with Odin Lloyd

On Tuesday, June 18, 2013, investigators executed a search warrant for 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. As a result of this search, digital video evidence was seized and reviewed by investigators from the home surveillance system. The video surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro has been forensically preserved by the Massachusetts State Police Digital Evidence and Multimedia Section (DEMS) and investigators have had the opportunity to review many of the high definition images captured by the surveillance equipment at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

The surveillance video seized from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez arriving in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez is the operator of a white Audi SUV when he arrives in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video further shows that Aaron Hernandez meets two males in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators have been able to determine through the surveillance images that Ernest Wallace was one of the two males who Aaron Hernandez meets in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 12:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video reveals that Aaron Hernandez, Shayanna Jenkins, Ernest Wallace, and a third male individual enter the residence at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Interior surveillance footage shows Aaron Hernandez pass through the living room area of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro while holding an item, identified by investigators as being consistent with a firearm. Aaron Hernandez is observed on the surveillance video moving the item believed to be a firearm between his hands as he passes through the living room.

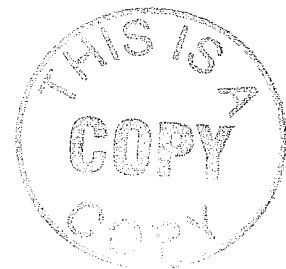
The surveillance video from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows three male individuals exit the residence in the area of the garage at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The first two male individuals exit the residence together, while the third male individual exits the residence several seconds after the first two. The first male individual depicted on surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 is identified as Aaron Hernandez. Aaron Hernandez is wearing a very



light colored or white hooded sweatshirt, dark colored pants, and light colored footwear. The second male individual depicted on the surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 has dark complexion and is wearing a short sleeve light colored shirt, dark colored pants, and dark colored shoes. The third male individual depicted on the surveillance video exiting the residence at approximately 1:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 has the darkest complexion of the three male individuals and is wearing a blue and white long sleeve shirt and dark colored pants. Investigators have identified this male as Ernest Wallace. Ernest Wallace appears to carry a light colored plastic bag in his right hand. All three male individuals walk down the driveway towards the street and exit the view of the surveillance video. A short time later, a silver four door vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima reverses up the driveway and parks near the garage. Aaron Hernandez exits the driver's seat of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima and approaches the garage. Ernest Wallace exits the front passenger's seat of the silver vehicle and walks to the rear of the vehicle while apparently manipulating an object in his hands. Ernest Wallace walks around the vehicle and opens the trunk through the open driver's side door after finding the trunk to be locked. Ernest Wallace then opens the trunk of the silver vehicle and appears to manipulate objects inside the trunk for several seconds. Ernest Wallace appears to hand Aaron Hernandez an item that he retrieved from the trunk of the silver vehicle. Aaron Hernandez enters the silver four door vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima with the item that Ernest Wallace retrieved from the trunk of the vehicle. All three male individuals exited the silver vehicle and entered the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The three male individuals then exit the garage and enter the silver vehicle at approximately 1:12 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Ernest Wallace enters the driver's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Aaron Hernandez enters the front passenger's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The third male individual wearing a short sleeve light colored shirt, dark colored pants, and dark colored shoes enters the silver vehicle through the rear driver's side door. The silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima then drives down the driveway and disappears from the view of the surveillance system. The surveillance video shows that the side view mirror on the driver's side of the silver vehicle consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima was still in place when the vehicle exited the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 1:12 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Surveillance Video from Blue Hill Express Service Station

On the evening of Sunday, June 23, 2013, investigators received information that a vehicle that Aaron Hernandez was driving may have refueled at the Blue Hill Express service station on Route 138 in the vicinity of Route 93 in Canton during the early morning hours of June 17, 2013. Investigators visited the service station and met with the station attendant. This station attendant was also working the overnight shift on June 17, 2013. The attendant informed investigators that Aaron Hernandez visited the station, refueled his vehicle, and purchased some items from the convenience store which is attached to the service station at approximately 2:00 a.m. on June 17, 2013. The attendant informed investigators that the service station had numerous surveillance cameras and that video may be available.



The service station attendant provided investigators with the sales receipt for the fuel and the items that Aaron Hernandez purchased on Monday, June 17, 2013. Investigators viewed the fuel receipt and observed that 18.39 gallons of fuel was purchased at 2:09 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 using a Visa credit card belonging to Aaron Hernandez. The convenience store receipt revealed that a "BLACK & MILD CIGAR" and "Bubble Yum Cotton" bubble gum were purchased.

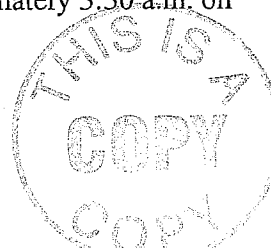
Investigators made arrangements with the owner of the Blue Hill Express service station to obtain surveillance video from the early morning hours of Monday, June 17, 2013. This video was obtained and viewed by investigators. The surveillance video shows a silver sedan entering the service station just after 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The operator of the silver sedan is identified as Aaron Hernandez. Aaron Hernandez refuels his vehicle and then enters the convenience store. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez is wearing a light colored or white hooded sweatshirt, dark pants, and light colored shoes while at the Blue Hills Express service station at approximately 2:00 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. On Monday, June 24, 2013, at 1:12 a.m., investigators departed the area of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro driving a 2012 Nissan Altima. Investigators determined that the driving time from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro directly to the Blue Hill Express service station was approximately twenty-five (25 minutes) at that time of the morning. Consequently, the evidence shows that Aaron Hernandez did not drive directly to Blue Hill Express. The evidence also shows that prior to arriving at Blue Hill Express Aaron Hernandez left the front passenger seat and became the operator of the vehicle.

The surveillance video at Blue Hill Express service station shows Aaron Hernandez purchasing a cigar and a package of what appears to be bubble gum. The surveillance video at Blue Hill Express service station then shows Aaron Hernandez entering the driver's seat and the third male individual entering the rear passenger's seat of the silver vehicle. The silver vehicle then exits the Blue Hill Express service station traveling in the direction of Route 93.

The time that the silver sedan departed from the Blue Hill Express service station, and the geographic location of the Blue Hill Express service station coincide with the timeline and route of travel that investigators believe Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace and the third male individual take to arrive at 10 Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. On Monday, June 24, 2013, investigators drove from the Blue Hill Express service station to 10 Fayston Street in Boston via Route 95/128 and Route 93. Investigators determined that the travel time is approximately 19 minutes.

Video Surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro Showing Activities at the Residence after the Murder of Odin Lloyd

The video surveillance from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows that the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima returns to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the same third male individual are observed exiting the silver vehicle in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on



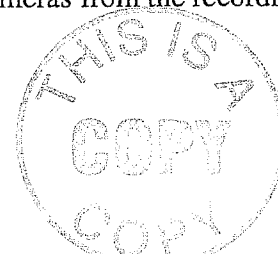
Monday, June 17, 2013. Aaron Hernandez is shown exiting the driver's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Ernest Wallace is shown exiting the front passenger seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. The third male individual is shown on surveillance exiting the rear driver's seat of the silver vehicle that is consistent with a 2012 Nissan Altima. Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual entered the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

The interior video surveillance at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez enter and exit the basement on several different occasions while also going into other rooms within the residence. Aaron Hernandez is shown on surveillance video to be in and out of the basement on several different occasions while also going to other rooms within the residence. On Monday, June 17, 2013, at approximately 3:33 a.m., Aaron Hernandez is observed to be standing at the entrance to the basement with what appears to be a gun in his hand. Aaron Hernandez is observed to move the gun between his hands. After about six minutes of being in the residence, Aaron Hernandez enters the basement for the final time after being inside his residence for approximately six minutes. There is no activity seen until the recording stops after 3:40 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

The exterior video surveillance at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro shows Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual exit the garage and approach the rented 2012 Nissan Altima parked in the driveway at approximately 4:52 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video surveillance further shows that Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and the third male individual enter the 2012 Nissan Altima and drive away from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 4:54 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video surveillance shows that a gray vehicle consistent with a gray Chrysler 300C entered the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:12 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Aaron Hernandez exited the driver's seat of the gray vehicle that is consistent with a Chrysler 300C upon arriving in the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:12 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that Ernest Wallace enters the driver's seat of the gray vehicle that is consistent with a Chrysler 300C. The surveillance video further shows that Ernest Wallace and the same third male individual drive away from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Video Surveillance System at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro

On Thursday, June, 20, 2013, investigators spoke with Michael Connors of Home-Tech Custom Design. Michael Connors installed the video surveillance system at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at the direction of Shayanna Jenkins. Among other things, Michael Connors told investigators that the surveillance system records the video of all cameras continuously unless a cable connecting a camera to the system is disconnected. Michael Connors stated that disconnecting a particular camera cable takes that camera off line while the system continues to record footage from the other connected cameras. Michael Connors further stated that he showed Aaron Hernandez how to disconnect specific cameras from the recording



device in May of 2013. Michael Connors went on to say that he clearly labeled the connections so that Aaron Hernandez could more easily disconnect cameras at locations within his home where and when he wanted to avoid surveillance recordings.

The Massachusetts State Police Digital Evidence and Multimedia Section determined that the time displayed on the surveillance video recovered from 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro differed from the accurate, world time, by 2 minutes and 46 seconds. Where times are described in this affidavit they have been adjusted to actual time. Investigators have followed the same procedure to determine the variance of all video surveillance times from accurate, world time. All video surveillance times in this affidavit are described in world time.

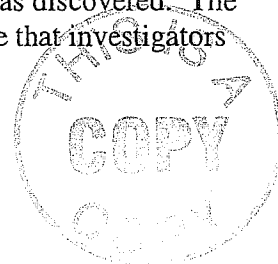
Video Surveillance from Fayston Street in Boston

Investigators learned from Boston Police Detectives that there was a video surveillance system at a residence on Fayston Street in Boston. This residence is located across the street from Odin Lloyd's and Shaquilla Thibou's apartment at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Boston Police investigators spoke with the homeowner and obtained a copy of the surveillance footage for Monday, June 17, 2013. Massachusetts State Police investigators reviewed the video surveillance footage and observed that a vehicle that is consistent with a silver colored Nissan Altima arrived in front of 10 Fayston Street in Boston at approximately 2:33 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The video shows a male individual, believed to be the victim Odin Lloyd, enter into the rear passenger's side of the vehicle. [This information is consistent with information provided to the police by Odin Lloyd's sister, Shaquilla Thibou.] Investigators were able to determine that there were three individuals inside the vehicle as it arrived at 10 Fayston Street in Boston. Investigators were able to determine that there were three individuals inside the silver vehicle when it arrived at 10 Fayston Street in Boston because the interior light illuminated the interior of the vehicle when the rear passenger's side door was opened. Investigators were also able to determine through the surveillance video that the operator of the apparent silver Nissan Altima was wearing a white or very light colored shirt. Additionally, investigators observed that the exterior side view mirror on the driver's side of the apparent silver Nissan Altima was intact and attached to the vehicle at that time.

Surveillance Video from John L. Dietsch Boulevard and Landry Avenue in North Attleboro

Investigators conducted a canvass in the area of the crime scene located in the vicinity of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. Investigators learned that there were several surveillance cameras facing the area of John Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. Investigators viewed several surveillance cameras and observed the following:

A vehicle entered John L. Dietsch Boulevard at approximately 3:20 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The vehicle traveled northbound on John L. Dietsch Boulevard toward 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard and the location where the body of Odin Lloyd was discovered. The arrival of the vehicle at this time and location is consistent with the time that investigators



arrived on John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro when they drove a 2012 Nissan Altima from 10 Fayston Street in Boston to 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro on Tuesday, June 25, 2013.

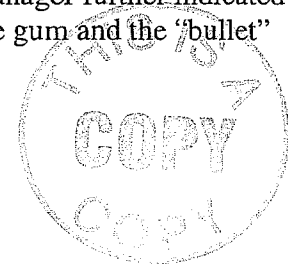
An inspection of the video surveillance from a business near the crime scene shows a vehicle traveling north on John L. Dietsch Boulevard towards the rear of 344 John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. This vehicle enters the secluded gravel construction area where the body of Odin Lloyd was discovered. This vehicle entered into the crime scene at approximately 3:23 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013 and exits the crime scene at approximately 3:27 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The time of this activity is consistent with the reports of employees at an adjacent business who heard gunshots between 3:00 a.m. and 3:30 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. Surveillance video shows a vehicle leaving the crime scene and turning left out onto John L. Dietsch Boulevard in the direction of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. Investigators are aware that the direction of travel is consistent with the vehicle coming from the area of Interstate 95.

Investigators inspected additional surveillance video that showed a vehicle traveling north from the direction of the crime scene toward Landry Avenue in North Attleboro. The vehicle passes this location at approximately 3:28 a.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Investigators located additional surveillance video showing a vehicle turning left onto Landry Avenue from John L. Dietsch Boulevard in North Attleboro. This vehicle is captured on surveillance video heading west on Landry Avenue in the direction of Westwood Estates and 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. This vehicle is shown at this location less than one minute before the vehicle arrives at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro.

Search of the Dumpster on the Property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car

On the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013, the Enterprise Rent-A-Car manager who had previously been interviewed by police contacted investigators with additional information. The manager indicated that she declined an offer from Aaron Hernandez's of blue bubblegum on the evening of Monday, June 17, 2013. The manager further indicated that she secured the keys to the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 in a safe inside Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the night of Monday, June 17, 2013 into Tuesday, June 17, 2013. The manager went on to indicate that she cleaned the silver 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented at approximately 7:45 a.m. on Tuesday, June 17, 2013. The manager indicated that while cleaning the 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented, she located four items that she disposed of in the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. The manager further indicated that she located a small vitamin water bottle in the front driver's side cup holder of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager went on to indicate that she located what appeared to be a piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing in the area underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager indicated that she found a piece of chewed blue bubble gum and a "bullet" underneath the child's drawing underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager further indicated that she used a piece of paper to pick up the piece of chewed blue bubble gum and the "bullet"



from the area underneath the driver's seat of the 2012 Nissan Altima. The manager also recalled that Aaron Hernandez produced Bubblicious Bubble Gum in a blue Bubblicious Bubble Gum wrapper and offered her a piece of gum while he was returning the silver 2012 Nissan Altima bearing Massachusetts Registration 536MX2 to Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro at approximately 5:30 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

Officers immediately traveled to Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro and secured the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers searched the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers located a bottle of Vitamin Water, a piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing, a piece of chewed blue bubble gum, and a spent .45 caliber spent cartridge casing inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the evening of Thursday, June 20, 2013. Officers showed the manager photographs of the bottle of Vitamin Water, the piece of paper containing a colorful child's drawing, the piece of chewed blue bubble gum, and the spent .45 caliber spent cartridge casing that were located inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro. The manager identified the items in the photographs as being the items that she removed from the 2012 Nissan Altima that Aaron Hernandez had rented and threw in the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro on the morning of Tuesday, June 18, 2013.

Second Search of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro

On Saturday, June 22, 2013, the Massachusetts State Police and the North Attleboro Police Department executed a search warrant at the residence of Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11/06/1989) located at 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive, North Attleboro, MA 02760 in regard to an ongoing criminal investigation.

During the course of the search warrant execution, investigators located a 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle with attached magazine inside a closed black gym bag that was on the back seat of a Toyota sedan that was parked inside the garage of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro. The rifle was collected as evidence by the State Police Firearms Identification Section.

The rifle was examined by a firearms examiner assigned to the Massachusetts State Police Firearms Identification Section. The State Police firearms examiner determined that the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle was functional and semi-automatic. The State Police firearms examiner test fired the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle and some of the ammunition contained within the magazine that was attached to the rifle when it was located by investigators. The State Police firearms examiner formed the opinion that the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle is a rifle within the meaning of and as defined in Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 140, section 121. The State Police firearms examiner also formed the opinion that the ammunition recovered from within the magazine that was attached to the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle is ammunition within the meaning of and as defined in Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 140, section 121. The State Police firearms examiner also



determined that the magazine that was attached to the 7.62x39mm caliber FEG Hungarian rifle was a Master Molder magazine with a thirty-three (33) round capacity. The Master Molder magazine contained thirty-three (33) live cartridges of 7.62x39mm caliber ammunition when it was located by investigators.

Investigators also located a box of .22 caliber "Game Loads" ammunition inside a Sentry Safe in the basement of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro during the search warrant execution on Saturday, June 22, 2013.

A query of the Massachusetts Department of Criminal Justice Information Services database revealed that Aaron Hernandez (DOB: 11/6/1989) did not have a valid or expired Massachusetts License to Carry Firearms or a Massachusetts Firearms Identification Card on Saturday, June 22, 2013. An additional search of the Massachusetts Department of Criminal Justice Information Services database revealed that 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro is not listed as an address on any Massachusetts License to Carry Firearms or Massachusetts Firearms Identification Cards.

Search of 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. A12, in Franklin

On Wednesday, June 26, 2013, investigators executed several search warrants at an apartment rented by Aaron Hernandez that is located at 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin. Investigators recovered the following items inside 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin: Two boxes of .45 caliber Seminole Arms ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Hornady ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Torbon ammunition; One box of .45 caliber Remington ammunition; One box of .22LR caliber Remington; Four boxes of 7.62 x 39mm Wolf ammunition; One box of 7.62 x 39mm Tulammo ammunition; and one loose live cartridge of 7.62 x 39mm Wolf ammunition.

Search of 2005 Hummer H2

On Wednesday, June 26, 2013, investigators executed a search warrant on a 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: 5GRGN23U15H123355) (Ohio Temporary Registration 497086) that was parked in the parking lot of 599 Old West Central Street in Franklin. The keys to the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: 5GRGN23U15H123355) (Ohio Temporary Registration 497086) were located inside 599 Old West Central Street, Apt. # A12, in Franklin. Investigators located a loaded .45 caliber Glock magazine inside the center console of the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: 5GRGN23U15H123355) (Ohio Temporary Registration 497086). Investigators also located two receipts and an envelope bearing the name Aaron Hernandez inside the 2005 Hummer H2 (VIN: 5GRGN23U15H123355) (Ohio Temporary Registration 497086).



Search of the Contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker

On Friday, June 28, 2013, a search warrant was executed on a locked container that contained all the items that were removed by Gillette Stadium staff from Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker upon Aaron Hernandez being released from the New England Patriots on Wednesday, June 26, 2013. No firearms, firearms feeding devices, ammunition, or other items of evidentiary value were located within the contents of Aaron Hernandez's New England Patriots Locker.

Seizure of the gray Chrysler 300C (Rhode Island Registration 451-375)

On the night of Thursday, June 27, 2013, the gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 that was rented by Aaron Hernandez on the evening of Monday, June 17, 2013 was located in the parking lot of the Huntington Woods Apartments located at 200 Blakeslee Street in Bristol, Connecticut. This gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 was shown on surveillance video leaving 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video further shows that Ernest Wallace was driving the gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 when it exited the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013. The surveillance video shows that a second male, whose identity is known to the police, was a passenger of the gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 when it exited the driveway of 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro at approximately 5:15 p.m. on Monday, June 17, 2013.

A resident of the Huntington Woods Apartments called the Bristol Police Department on the night of Thursday, June 27, 2013 to report that the gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 was parked in the parking lot of the apartment complex. The Bristol Police Department responded to the Huntington Woods Apartments and secured the locked Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375. The Bristol Police Department seized the locked Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 and towed it to the Bristol Police Department on the night of Thursday, June 27, 2013 into Friday, June 28, 2013. The Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 was secured in a locked garage at the Bristol Police Department.

On the morning of Saturday, June 29, 2013, Trooper Jeff Whitehead and Trooper Melvin Rodriguez took custody of the Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 from the Bristol Police Department in Bristol, Connecticut. The Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 was towed to the North Attleboro Police Department on a Massachusetts State Police flatbed tow truck. Trooper Jeff Whitehead and Trooper Melvin Rodriguez escorted the Massachusetts State Police tow truck and the Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 to the North Attleboro Police Department. The Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 was placed in a secure garage upon its arrival at the North Attleboro Police Department.



The Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 has remained locked each time it has been towed.

Arrest of Ernest Wallace

On Friday, June 28, 2013, Ernest Wallace surrendered himself to the Miramar Police Department in Florida on his warrant for Accessory After the Fact to Murder. Ernest Wallace was not in possession of a cellular telephone when he was arrested by the Miramar Police Department in Florida. Ernest Wallace also was not wearing the clothing that he was wearing on the early morning of Monday, June 17, 2013.

Autopsy

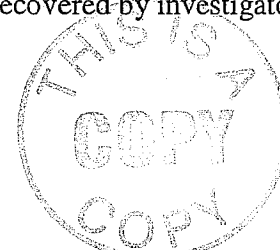
On Wednesday, June 19, 2013, Doctor William Zane of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner conducted the autopsy of Odin Lloyd. Doctor Zane determined that the cause of death was multiple gunshot wounds to the torso area of Odin Lloyd. Doctor William Zane determined that Odin Lloyd was shot in the back and a projectile was recovered in the area of the buttocks. There was a gunshot wound to the right abdomen and a projectile was recovered. There was a gunshot entrance wound to right forearm and there was an exit wound associated with this entrance wound. Two projectiles, consistent with .45 caliber class ammunition were recovered from the body of Odin Lloyd.

Doctor William Zane determined that Odin Lloyd suffered two penetrating wounds which entered Odin Lloyd in the vicinity of each nipple. These wounds completely penetrated the body and no projectiles associated with them were recovered from the body. The paths of both of these wounds were front to back. One projectile penetrated Odin Lloyd's chest, heart lung, liver, and back. The other projectile penetrated Odin Lloyd's chest, lung, ribs and back. Investigators have subsequently been able to recover two projectiles from directly beneath Odin Lloyd's final resting place. This evidence indicates that Odin Lloyd was shot two times in the chest after he was already lying supine on the ground. Doctor William Zane determined that the manner of Odin Lloyd's death was a homicide.

Ballistics

The State Police Firearms Identification Section analyzed the five (5) spent cartridge casings that were recovered from the area near where Odin Lloyd's body was discovered. The State Police Firearms Identification Section determined that the five spent cartridge casings were all .45 caliber and were all fired from the same unknown .45 caliber firearm.

The .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro was sent to the State Police Firearms Identification Section for ballistic analysis. The State Police Firearms Identification Section compared the .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators



from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro with the five spent cartridge casings recovered in close proximity to Odin Lloyd's body. The State Police Firearms Identification Section determined that the .45 caliber spent cartridge casing recovered by investigators from inside the dumpster on the property of Enterprise Rent-A-Car in North Attleboro and the five (5) .45 caliber spent cartridge casings recovered in close proximity to Odin Lloyd's body were all fired from the same unknown .45 caliber firearm.

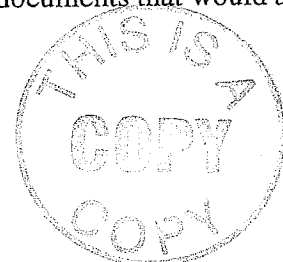
Several searches have been performed in the area between the crime scene and 22 Ronald C. Meyer Drive in North Attleboro utilizing the State Police SERT Team, the State Police Underwater Recovery Unit, the State Police K-9 section with police K-9's that are trained in the detection of firearms and ammunition, and the State Police Firearms Identification Section with metal detectors, but a .45 caliber firearm has not been recovered during the course of the investigation. Several residences and vehicles have also been searched, some of which are referenced in this affidavit, but as of the application for this search warrant, a .45 caliber firearm has not been recovered during this investigation.

Conclusion

I have personal knowledge, based upon experience and training, that crimes of violence often involve a struggle and the use of weapons or other instrumentalities. I also know that the person or persons participating in the commission of a violent offense are in contact with the physical surroundings and often leave evidence or trace evidence that if collected will help to identify the perpetrators and / or the nature of the crime. I am aware that there is often an attempt to alter, destroy, remove, clean up, or cover up evidence of a crime. I am aware that the perpetrator of a violent crime may remove evidence from the scene and conceal it or destroy it in an attempt to secret it from investigators. I am aware that evidence of a crime may be left in the form of gunshot residue, clothing, physiological fluids, palm prints, fingerprints, shoe prints, fibers, footprints, hair, saliva, semen, blood, firearms, pistols, revolvers, rifles, shotguns, ammunition, spent cartridge casings, projectiles, cutting instruments, knives, cellular telephones, pieces of identification in print, photograph, or video that may identify any or all of the parties named in the investigation. I am aware that many of these items are minute and / or microscopic, and are often referred to as trace and biological evidence. I am also aware that specialized training and equipment is needed for the collection of such trace and biological evidence.

Based on the aforementioned information provided in this affidavit, I have probable cause to believe that evidence of the crimes of Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 265, section 1 and Accessory After the Fact to Murder in violation of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 274, section 4 will be found on and within a gray Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375.

I therefore respectfully request that the court issued a search warrant authorizing the search of the gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 [VIN: 2C3CCA6G0DH665474] for trace / biological evidence including blood, serums, and skin; DNA; clothing; shoes; fingerprints; firearms; firearms feeding devices; ammunition; cellular telephones; computers; GPS devices; rental agreement; receipts or documents that would aid in



establishing where the vehicle was between the time that it was rented and the time that it was located by the Bristol Police Department; documents and photographs that would help establish the relationship between Aaron Hernandez, Ernest Wallace, and Odin Lloyd. I further respectfully request that the court authorize the seizure and further search / forensic processing of any of the above evidence should it be found during the search warrant execution. I also respectfully request permission to video record and photograph the gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 [VIN: 2C3CCAAG0DH665474] described in this affidavit.

The gray 2013 Chrysler 300C bearing Rhode Island Registration 451-375 [VIN: 2C3CCAAG0DH665474] is registered to Enterprise Rent-A-Car of Rhode Island and is in the custody of the North Attleboro Police Department at the time that this affidavit was written
