


6. [REDACTED] informed the police that she had been Pamela Ferriere's nurse for the past two weeks. Today Pamela had three visitors. [REDACTED] overheard Robert say that Travis was coming over. [REDACTED] said that Travis came into the room holding a small duffle bag. She turned and saw Travis holding a black handgun with both hands. Travis was pointing the gun at his mother, Pamela. [REDACTED] then ran from the room and hid behind medical equipment. [REDACTED] then heard two gun shots.
7. At approximately 5:20 p.m., Troopers Kelly Wardner and William Bright of the New Hampshire State Police spoke with Travis Frink. Frink was advised of his *Miranda* rights and elected to waive them. He admitted that he went to Dartmouth-Hitchcock today to kill his mother, and shot her several times in her hospital room. He drove up from Rhode Island to the hospital today.
8. Based on the foregoing, there is probable cause to believe that Travis Frink committed the crime of first-degree murder (one count) contrary to RSA 630:1-a, by purposely causing the death of Pamela Ferriere by shooting her.
